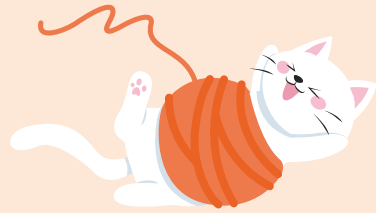

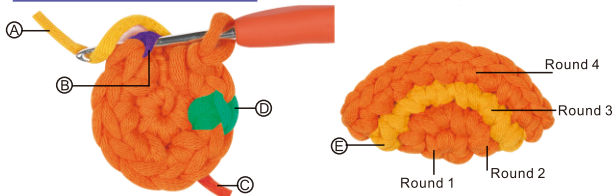

- ④ Working yarn Yarn connected to the ball of yarn.
- ⑤ Top loops of a stitch Where you usually insert the hook, to start the next stitch.
- ⑥ Yarn tail (end) End of yarn not connected to the ball of yarn.
- ⑦ Single crochet stitch The main stitch used in amigurumi.
- ⑧ Round A series of crochet stitches in a circle. This illustrated crochet piece is made of 4 rounds.

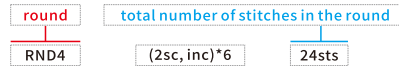
This pattern is written in US terminology

How to read the pattern?



What stitches to do in this round, and how many times

For round 4, repeat the pattern in the brackets for 6 times. The pattern is: single crochet in each of the first 2 stitches, then increase stitch in the next stitch. Because an increase is actually 2 single crochet stitches in the same stitch, the total number of stitches in this round is 24.

The terms "1ch and ss" are considered a "joined round" in crochet terminology.
A "joined round" is not counted as a stitch in crochet.

Materials

Single strand cotton yarn, 2.5mm hook, Stitch marker,
Safety eyes, Safety back pieces, Fiberfill, Yarn needle.

Abbreviations

ch=chain stitch

inc=increase

ss=slip stitch

Rnd=round

(,,)*n=work all instructions in the brackets as many
times as directed.

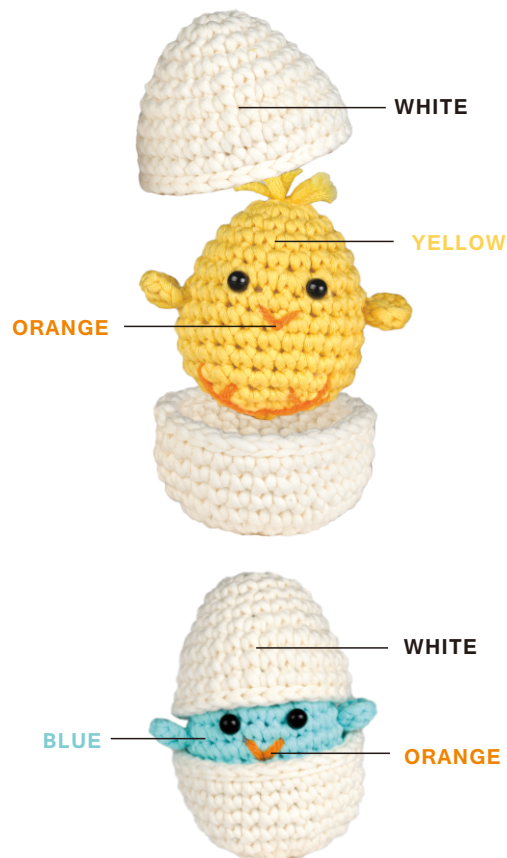
[,,]=work all instructions in the square brackets in the
same stitch.

sc=single crochet

dec=decrease

st(s)=stitch(es)

dc=double crochet



Top Tips:

Start with a magic ring, working in a spiral so you don't need to join the rounds at the end, just keep going, working into the next stitch on the previous round.

Start with A Magic Ring:

Wrap the yarn around your little finger and then bring the yarn up to your index finger. Pinch the yarn tail with thumb and middle finger. Make a loop around your middle finger and pinch the crossover of the yarn. Insert hook into the loop, yarn over/under the hook and pull up a loop. The loop on your middle finger will become a magic ring.

1 the Chick's Main Body

(Make 2; One for Each Color)

(Start with yellow or blue yarn)

Rnd1: Working into a magic ring: 1ch, 6sc = 6sts

Place a locking stitch marker in first st. Moving the stitch marker up with each rnd, cont as folls.



Rnd2: 6inc = 12sts

Rnd3: (3sc,inc)*3 times = 15sts

Rnd4: (2sc,inc,2sc)*3 times = 18sts

Rnd5: (5sc,inc)*3 times = 21sts

Rnd6: (3sc,inc,3sc)*3 times = 24sts

Rnds7-11: 24sc = 24sts

Eyes: Insert safety eyes between Rounds 6-7 of the main body, spacing them 4 stitches apart.

Then put on safety back pieces.

Rnd12: (2sc,dec)*6 times = 18sts

Stuff the fabric with fiberfill.

Rnd13: (sc,dec)*6 times = 12sts

Rnd14: 6dec = 6sts

Break yarn, sew hole closed by stitching through the front loops of last round and then weave in end.



2 Wing(Make 4; Two for Each Color)

(Start with yellow or blue yarn)

Rnd1: Working into a magic ring: 2ch,3dc,2ch,ss

Fasten off and leave a long end for sewing.



3 Sew Up

Note: Please refer to the video or pictures for details.

- ① Take the side with eyes as the front side of the main body.
- ② Wings: Sew the wings between Rounds 7 and 8 on both sides of the main body. Ensure bilateral symmetry.
- ③ Beak: Take out the 12-inch orange yarn and embroider a V-shape on Round 8 of the front midline of the chick's main body.

④ Claws: Take 12-inch orange yarn and embroider chick claws on Rounds 11 - 14 of the chick's main body on both sides. Ensure bilateral symmetry.

⑤ Feathers: Take 3 pieces of yellow/blue yarn with a length of about 2 inches each, fold them in half. Then take a piece of the same color yarn with a length of about 10 inches and tie it at the folded part. Finally, sew them onto the top of the chick's main body.



4 Eggshell A(Make 2)

(Start with white yarn)

Rnd1: Working into a magic ring:

1ch,7sc = 7sts

Rnd2: 7inc = 14sts

Rnd3: 14sc = 14sts



Rnd4: (sc,inc)*7 times = 21sts

Rnd5: 21sc = 21sts

Rnd6: (2sc,inc)*7 times = 28sts

Rnds7-9: 28sc = 28sts

Fasten off and weave in end.

Work a round of slip stitches on Round 9.

Fasten off and weave in end.

5 Eggshell B(Make 2)

(Start with white yarn)

Rnd1: Working into a magic ring:1ch,7sc = 7sts

Rnd2: 7inc = 14sts

Rnd3: (sc,inc)*7 times = 21sts

Rnd4: (2sc,inc)*7 times = 28sts

Rnds5-8: 28sc = 28sts

Fasten off and weave in end.

Work a round of slip stitches on Round 8.
